Replacement Instructions Read Aloud Component page 9

Before Reading

- Introduce the book, *Tumble Bumble*.
- Read the title of the story.
- Introduce the author and illustrator.

What does the author do? What does the illustrator do?

- Introduce the front cover, back cover, and spine.
- Make a Prediction.

Why do you think the animals are so happy?

During Reading

- Invite children to finish the rhyming pattern of a sentence. Pause before saying the rhyming word or give children a clue using onset and rime to say a word slowly.
- Make predictions throughout the story. Use picture clues to guide discussions.
- Review the vocabulary words as you read: strolled, glee, avail, toad,

After Reading

- Ask a connection question: What was your favorite animal in the story?

 Do the animals in this story remind you of the animals from another story we have read together?

 (Felicia Bond is the illustrator of the books If You Give A Pig A Party, Time for School Mouse)
- Look at the page where the animals are eating the food in the house. Ask children to tell you food that they like to eat.
