Replacement Instructions Read Aloud Component page 9

Before Reading

- Introduce the book, *Tumble Bumble*.
- Read the title of the story.
- Introduce the author and illustrator.
What does the author do? What does the illustrator do?
- Introduce the front cover, back cover, and spine.
- Make a Prediction.
Why do you think the animals are so happy?

During Reading

- Invite children to finish the rhyming pattern of a sentence. Pause before saying the rhyming word or give children a clue using onset and rime to say a word slowly.
- Make predictions throughout the story. Use picture clues to guide discussions.
- Review the vocabulary words as you read: strolled, glee, avail, toad,

After Reading

- Ask a connection question: *What was your favorite animal in the story?*
Do the animals in this story remind you of the animals from another story we have read together? (Felicia Bond is the illustrator of the books *If You Give A Pig A Party*, *Time for School Mouse*)
- Look at the page where the animals are eating the food in the house. Ask children to tell you food that they like to eat.
