

DIY Frog Lantern

Learning about habitats is fun with this creative fine motor activity. Children learn about the pond, what lives on it, what lives in it, what frogs eat, and life cycles.

For ages 3 and up
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Froggy Lantern Activity

Materials:

- Mini lime green lantern
- Green construction paper (Item #87940-GR)
- Pink construction paper (Item #13337-PK)
- White construction paper (Item #87940-WH)
- Wiggly eyes (Item #61181)
- Black marker (Item #40459)
- All-purpose glue (Item #47358)

Optional Materials:

- White cupcake liners for white of eyes
- String to hang lantern



Process:

1. Unfold and assemble lantern.
2. Teacher can precut strips of green paper for legs and pink paper for tongue. Precut white circles for eyes unless using cupcake liners. Draw frog feet and cut out.
3. Have children fold 2 green strips accordion style for legs. Roll pink strips for tongue.
4. Using glue, make the eyes by attaching 2 white circles (or cupcake liners) near the top of the lantern. Glue a wiggly eye in the center of each white circle.
5. Use a black marker to draw a mouth in the center of the lantern.
6. Attach tongue in center of mouth using glue.
7. Glue both legs to underneath of lantern, and then glue a foot on each leg.

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
